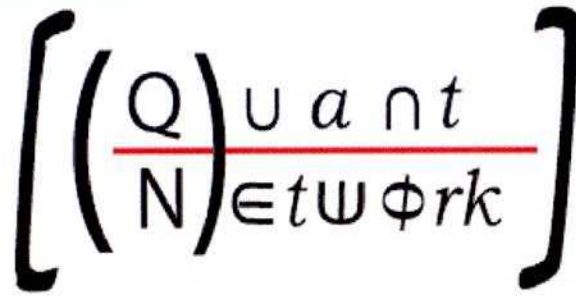

Although 2008-09 was our first year, it was very productive. We were able to form relationships with Madison Square Garden and the Chazin Group. Our activities included:

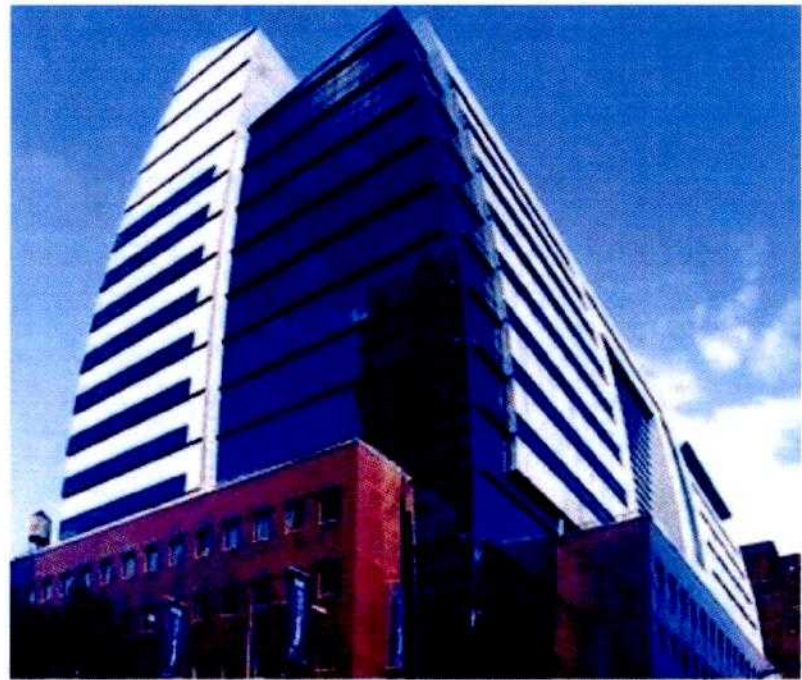
